



## ***2019-2020 Pay to Play Class Registration***

ASA is offering pay to play classes for the 2019-2020. Registration is on a first-come-first served basis. This enrollment is part of the arts class request process. Submission of this form and the deposit completes the enrollment in the class. See website for specific details. A deposit of the first month's fees is due at the time of submission.

Dates: Monday – Friday (no class on early release days)

Cost: \$100 / month – Payment is due on the 1st of each month. Total fee for the class is \$700. (There will not be a payment due for the month of December or March in order to offset the holiday and schedules of the school year.)

### **MUSIC**

#### **Introduction to Classical Guitar (grades 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>)**

Intro to Guitar - Period 5, Monday-Friday

This class offers 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students the opportunity to study beginning classical guitar in a group setting. Students will need to provide a nylon-string guitar and supplies as outlined in the Guitar Department website to participate in the class. The majority of the instruction will be in classical music and learning to play finger style. The course includes music reading, classical guitar technique, and ensemble work. Students will receive a regular assessment in this class with a final grade. Students will still be concurrently enrolled in choir and piano. Limit to 15 students.

#### **Introduction to Jazz Band (grades 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>)**

Period 9, Monday-Friday

An open-enrollment beginning jazz class, open to all instruments. Skills learned in this class will help students prepare for auditioning into the Jazz Orchestra class. Students will study jazz style, theory, improvisation, and listening skills. Audition or instructor permission required. Students will receive a regular assessment in this class with a final grade. Students will still be concurrently enrolled in their regular ASA arts program. Limit to 20 students.

#### **Electric Guitar (grades 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>)**

This class offers students an opportunity to acquire basic and intermediate levels of playing on the electric guitar. Students will study a variety of styles including early blues, early rock, country-blues, classical rock, modern rock, and jazz. Students must provide their own equipment outlined by the instructor. Students may be considered for enrollment if they have successfully completed Guitar Foundations 1 or can demonstrate equivalent skills. Students will receive a regular assessment in this class with a final grade. Limit to 15 students.

#### **Beginning/Intermediate Class Piano (grades 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>)**

Period 9, Monday-Friday

This class offers 9<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students the opportunity to study classical piano in a group setting. Students work independently at full-size Yamaha digital keyboards with individual headphones. Class emphasizes solo literature from each stylistic period, ensemble literature, technique, and theory. This class will accept students at all levels of instruction. If you have always wanted to study piano as a high school student at ASA, this is your opportunity. Students will receive a regular assessment in this class with a final grade. Students will still be concurrently enrolled in their regular ASA arts program. Limit to 14 students.

#### **Music History & Culture (grades 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>)**

Period 9, Monday-Friday

This project-based course will emphasize the historical, theoretical, practical and cultural side to music. Students will learn how to critically listen and discuss all forms of music –medieval to modern classical forms, jazz, rock, folk, music theatre, film music, and more. There are specific topics that will remain on 3-4 year study cycle so students can repeat the class. This class is available to all Junior and Senior music majors. You may contract for Honors credit. Freshman and sophomores are eligible if they are also concurrently enrolled in Wind Ensemble, Chamber Orchestra, Advanced Piano or Concert Choir. Students will receive a regular assessment in this class with a final grade. Students will still be concurrently enrolled in their regular ASA arts program. Limit to 20 students.

**Arts Management (grades 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>)**

Period 9, Monday-Friday

An introduction to the field of arts management, this course will cover areas of incorporation, marketing, fundraising, education, community engagement, and will use ASA performances as practical applications of the classroom work. Students will receive a regular assessment in this class with a final grade. Limit to 16 students.

**THEATRE ARTS**

**Middle School Theatre 1: Foundations (grades 5<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>)**

Period 3, Monday-Friday

Students in this course will begin their study of theatre covering elements of theatre history and literature, theory, performance, and production. This is the same course offered to incoming 5<sup>th</sup> grade students during the lottery enrollment period. This is the first in the course sequence for theatre students in 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Students will still be concurrently enrolled in choir and piano. Limit to 16 students.

**Arts Management (grades 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>)**

Period 9, Monday-Friday

An introduction to the field of arts management, this course will cover areas of incorporation, marketing, fundraising, education, community engagement, and will use ASA performances as practical applications of the classroom work. Students will receive a regular assessment in this class with a final grade. Limit to 16 students.

**How to Register:**

We will be accepting registration forms starting on Monday, February 25, 2019 from current ASA students. Space in each program is limited. Registration is first-come, first-served. All students indicating interest after the class has been filled will be placed on a waiting list. Classes not meeting minimum enrollment requirements will be cancelled and deposits refunded.
