SUMMER READING

Students are required to choose 1 (Standard) and 2 (Advanced) of the books listed from the SUMMER READING CHART and have it read by the first day of school.

BOOK BISTRO

Throughout the year students partake in a supplemental reading program called “The Book Bistro”. Students are given a theme and they select books to read based on that theme for their first “Book Bistro” card. They then continue reading any book of choice and create “Book Bistro” cards (information and requirements will be given in class). As a culminating event, the students partake in a “Book Bistro” where they discuss and pitch one of their favorite books from the quarter. Parents and caretakers will be expected to purchase/rent books along the way based on the student’s choice.

LITERATURE CIRCLES

In Quarter 4, students will partake in Literature Circles. They are expected to choose 1 book from a list labeled “Quarter 4, The Silenced Voice Perspectives”. This LIVE list will be distributed towards the end of Quarter 3. We will post reminders and notices throughout the year so that families are prepared.
