

ASA Performing Arts College Prep Student Application

Program and Process

- Students interested in applying to a collegiate program to seriously pursue a performing arts career path are invited to complete this application.
- Students are required to submit all required documents to the ASA Arts Director and PACP advisor by the deadline.
- The Arts Director, PACP advisor, and required arts departments, will determine student acceptance.

Students in the program will have one study hall period with the PACP advisor during their morning class schedule. The study hall will replace one academic class (either math or foreign language) as specified in the school policy and on the application. Additionally, students assigned a study hall in the afternoon may use the time for practice and college prep work, if space is available.

The PACP program will be overseen by an ASA faculty advisor. Students that are accepted into the program will see PACP on their regular school schedule. Students must meet specific written and performance requirements of the course to receive credit. The class will be graded pass/fail.

Step 1: Student intent for the program

Provide a statement of artistic goals and an action plan for achievement. This will serve as a first step for the school to understand how the student intends to utilize the additional time in their school day and

how the school can support a PACP applicant through senior year and after graduation. <u>Attach to this application</u>.

Step 2: Relevant Training outside ASA

Provide a one-page resume of training/enrichment received in your performing arts area. Include experience in master classes, private lessons, summer training programs, competition results, and other relevant activities that would provide more depth and detail about your artistic background and commitment to your area of study. Attach to this application.

Step 3: Letters of Recommendation

Submit email addresses from 2 teachers/mentors. They should be from a mentor outside of ASA if possible, such as:

- 1. Your private teacher or regular training teacher
- 2. The director of an outside arts organization that you have been a member for at least 2 years

A Recommendation Submission Form will be sent to these teachers.
