This is a planned transition with ASA's long-time Head of School, **Leah Fregulia**, who will continue to work alongside Lujan through the end of the 2024-2025 school year to ensure a smooth and collaborative handover.



Lujan brings a wealth of experience and a proven track record in educational leadership as founding Chief Administrator of ASU Prep Academy and serving as a school board member for the Phoenix Union High School District from 2002-2010.
