ASA's mission is to inspire creative thinkers and leaders through providing an innovative concentration in college preparation informed by the performing arts.

This faculty member designs and delivers curriculum for 11th and 12th grade students. Eleventh grade curriculum includes Standard College Prep and AP United States History. The curriculum explores the rich and complex nature of this nation including the origins of American political thought and how the nation has dealt with issues such as equality, liberty, federalism, and group identity. The 12th grade curriculum is United States Government & Economics. A critical focus is analyzing different economic systems as well as the functions of government and how both apply to the citizens day to day. All students participate in activities that include understanding texts by a variety of authors, using original source documents which improves their capacity to analyze, discuss, and write well-researched historical and/or topical arguments. Some classes require a faculty member that can facilitate Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment levels of instruction.

Class sizes are approximately 28 students. Academic teachers have daily prep time for curriculum planning, meeting, integrating, and assessing. The teacher will be responsible for writing their own curriculum to align with state standards and are asked to differentiate their curriculum using additional resources as needed to support student growth and achievement. This teacher works closely with the Social Studies Department and the 11th and 12th grade teams to provide a supportive and integrated learning experience.

ASA teachers provide an academic curriculum that is rigorous, relevant, and aligned with ASA's mission and core values. Curriculum development and implementation reflects Arizona State Standards layered with ASA's innovative college prep focus that fosters intellectual curiosity, emphasizes active engagement, project-based learning, inquiry-based discussions, research, advanced written and oral skills, and collaboration.

ASA is devoted to fostering an inclusive environment where the enjoyment and benefits of a college preparatory and performing arts education are accessible to the entire community.

- Communicate consistently and professionally with families about student progress and needs.
- Collaborate with colleagues to plan instruction, align curriculum, and support students.
- Participate in professional development and apply learning to improve practice.
- Implement school policies, procedures, and curriculum with fidelity.
- Support students' social-emotional development alongside academic growth.
- Manage classroom behavior using proactive and restorative practices.
- Integrate technology effectively to enhance learning experiences.
- Uphold professional ethics, confidentiality, and legal responsibilities.
- Contribute to the broader school community through events, meetings, and initiatives.
